





Flower Zipper Clutch

Featuring a sophisticated combination of textiles like linen and wool, the Flower Zipper Clutch comes in three sizes. From durable cork to dainty calicos, create your own aesthetic by trying a different fabric medium for each petal. Unlike traditional machine embroidery applique where the design is secured with a satin stitch, raw edges of the pretty petals are surrounded with whimsical outline stitches. The clutch is fully lined, plus Kimberbell makes installing a zipper remarkably easy in-the-hoop.

HOOP: 5 x 7

Embroidery Field: 4.50×5.64 " or 114.3×143.26 mm Finished Size: $4\frac{1}{4} \times 5\frac{1}{2}$ "

STABILIZER: Cut-away

Cutting Instructions SMALL:

Fabric A:

Outside Back Piece cut (1) $5\% \times 6\%$ "
Border Pieces 2 & 3 cut (2) $5\% \times 2\%$ "
Main Fabric Piece 1 cut (1) $5\% \times 5\%$ "

Fabric B:

Lining Back cut (1) $5\% \times 6\%$ " Lining Below Zipper cut (1) $5\% \times 6\%$ " Lining Above Zipper cut (1) $5\% \times 2\%$ "

Fabrics C-F:

Flower Petals cut (1) 2 x 3" each

Fabric G:

Flower Center cut (1) 2 x 2"

Materials Needed MEDIUM:

HOOP: 6 x 10

Embroidery Field: 5.47×6.65 " or 138.94×168.91 mm Finished Size: $5\frac{1}{4} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ "

STABILIZER: Cut-away

Fabric A:

Outside Back Piece cut (1) $6\frac{1}{2} \times 7\frac{1}{2}$ "
Border Pieces 2 & 3 cut (2) $6\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "
Main Fabric Piece 1 cut (1) $6\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric B:

Lining Back $cut (1) 6\% \times 7\%$ "
Lining Below Zipper $cut (1) 6\% \times 7\%$ "
Lining Above Zipper $cut (1) 6\% \times 2\%$ " $cut (1) 6\% \times 2\%$ "

Fabrics C-F:

Flower Petals cut **(1)** 2 x 4" each

Fabric G:

Flower Center cut (1) $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "


Pattern Key



Indicates thread color change.

Corresponds with the specific embroidery machine step.

A Fat Sixteenth is 9 x 11" A Fat Eighth is 9 x 21" A Fat Quarter is 18 x 21"



Flower Zipper Clutch Template

Materials Needed LARGE:

HOOP: 8 x 8

Embroidery Field: 6.52 x 7.52" or 165.61 x 191.01 mm

Finished Size: 61/4 x 71/2"

Cutting Instructions LARGE:

Fabric A:

Outside Back Piece cut (1) $7\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ "
Border Pieces 2 & 3 cut (2) $7\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "
Main Fabric Piece 1 cut (1) $7\frac{1}{2} \times 7\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric B:

Lining Back cut (1) $7\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ " Lining Below Zipper cut (1) $7\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ " cut (1) $7\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabrics C-F:

Flower Petals cut **(1)** 2½ x 4½" each

Fabric G:

Flower Center cut (1) 3 x 3"

Prepare the Following:



A. Wrong sides together, take
Pieces 2 & 3 from Fabric A and
iron them in half, the long way.



B. Wrong sides together, take the **Lining Above the Zipper Piece** from Fabric B iron it in half, the long way.



C. Wrong sides together, take Lining Below the Zipper Piece from Fabric B, iron down about 1" on one short side of fabric.

Embroidery Instructions:

• Hoop stabilizer only

 Stitch the placement line directly onto the stabilizer

 Place the oversized piece of batting on top of the stabilizer, completely covering the placement line





• Stitch the piece 1 placement line





Piece 1:



A. Place Piece 1 right side up, completely covering section 1.



B. Stitch the tack-down line.





B. Change thread to desired color. Stitch the straight quilting stitch.



leave 1/4" on outer edge

for seam allowance

Petal 1: 6.



A. Stitch the petal 1 placement line.





B. Place Fabric C, right side up, completely covering the placement line.

Note: All tack-down lines are part of the stitches visible in the finished project.



C. Change thread to desired color. Stitch the petal 1 tack-down line.

D. Trim fabric close to the stitch line.

Note: Leave ¼" of fabric on outer edge of clutch for seam allowance. SVG file includes ¼" allowance.

Note: Change thread to desired color for all sketch lines. The tack-down lines will show in finished project.



Petal 2:



A. Stitch petal 2 placement line.





B. Place Fabric D, right side up, completely covering the placement line.



C. Stitch the petal 2 tack-down line.



D. Trim fabric close to the stitch line.



Petal 3:



A. Stitch the petal 3 placement line.



B . Place Fabric E, **right side up**, completely covering the placement line.



C. Stitch the petal 3 tack-down line.



D. Trim fabric close to the stitch line.



Petal 4:



A. Stitch petal 4 placement line.




B • Place Fabric F, **right side up**, completely covering the placement line.



C. Stitch the petal 4 tack-down line.





D. Trim fabric close to the stitch line, leaving ¼" seam allowance on outer edge.

Note: Leave ¼" of fabric on outer edge of clutch for seam allowance. SVG file includes ¼" allowance.

1 Flower Center:



A. Stitch flower center placement line.



B . Place Fabric G, **right side up**, completely covering the placement line.



C. Stitch the flower center tack-down line.



D. Trim fabric close to the stitch line leaving ¼" seam allowance on outer edge.

Note: Leave ¼" of fabric on outer edge of clutch for seam allowance. SVG file includes ¼" allowance. Stitch the sketch lines (Most lines are in the inside of the flower, while others may extend outside of the petal.)



12. • Stitch the trimming/placement line for piece 2





13. • Trim fabric close to the stitch line (DO NOT PLACE PIECE 2 AT THIS TIME.)



• Stitch the zipper placement stitch



• Remove hoop from machine

• Carefully trim the batting from **inside** the box (**Do not cut through the stabilizer.**)



trim batting inside the zipper placement line

- Using the zipper placement line as a guide, place the zipper right side up, within the stitched box, with the pull on the left side (The zipper pull and zipper stop should be outside of the box, so they won't go under the embroidery needle.)
 - Use paper tape to hold the zipper in place (The paper tape placed at each end will also help the presser foot glide over the zipper teeth when stitching.)




• Return hoop to machine

• Stitch the zipper tack-down line




• Remove tape



Note: If you raised the presser foot for this step, be sure to lower the foot to its original position before proceeding to **Direction Step 18.**

Place the raw edges of pressed Piece 2 on the trimming/placement line stitched in Direction Step 12, centering the fabric along the stitch line










• Flip Piece 2 up so that the fold aligns just below the zipper teeth

• Use paper tape to hold the fabric in place



• Change thread to desired color

- Stitch the tack-down line
- Remove tape






Note: This stitch will be seen in the finished product, so make sure the thread is the desired color. This stitch is also part of the finishing top stitches.

Before moving onto the next step, check the tack-down line to be sure the fabric is evenly spaced next to the zipper. If you are pleased with the stitches, move forward to Direction Step 22.

If the fabric somehow shifted while stitching, now is the time to carefully remove those stitches and repeat the step.

• Remove hoop from machine


• From the back of the hoop, carefully cut away the stabilizer that is **under** the zipper (You will see the back of the zipper.)

- Place the pressed "Lining Below the Zipper Fabric" right side up, on the back of the hoop, so the fold is aligned just below the zipper teeth
- Tape in place



back of hoop



- Return hoop to machine
- Stitch the tack-down line
- Remove tape



back of hoop

- Place pressed Piece 3 on the **front of the** hoop aligning the fold just above the zipper teeth
 - Tape in place



front of hoop

• Stitch the tack-down line

26 • Remove tape






front of hoop

• Remove hoop from machine, turn to back of hoop

• Place the pressed "Lining Above the Zipper" aligning the fold just **above** the zipper teeth

• Tape in place



back of hoop

? • Return hoop to machine

- Stitch the tack-down line
- Remove tape





back of hoop

• Open your zipper ¾ of the way



front of hoop

• Place Outside Backing Piece, **right side down**, **on top** of the entire bag, completely covering the entire perimeter of stitches



front of hoop

• Stitch the tack-down line



front of hoop

- Remove hoop from machine
- Turn hoop to the back
- Place the final lining piece on the back of the hoop, right side down, making sure it covers the entire box previously stitched
- Tape corners down



back of hoop

- Return hoop to machine
- Stitch the final stitch outline (This stitch leaves an opening to turn the bag right side out.)



• Remove tape



back of hoop


• Unhoop project

• Trim around the entire box about 1/4" away from the seam line



• Clip corners to reduce bulk

A. Cut across the corner of the seam allowance, being careful not to cut through the stitches.



B. Trim again at a slight angle, from the corner up the seam allowance, about 1" on each side to reduce bulk.

- Turn bag through the opening in the lining
- Turn bag through the opening dosed or use hem tape to close the opening



- Turn your zipper pouch right side out through the open zipper
- Poke corners with a blunt tip to square
- Press with steam to finish









Your project is complete, but the fun with Kimberbell doesn't have to end. We hope you'll enjoy making this pattern many times over. Ask your local shop about Kimberbell "Flying to Pieces" (KD609), "The Kristine Pouch" (KD616), or "The Crossbody Bag Trio" (KD543) zipper pouches.
