Fabric Requirements & Notions/Hardware

Check back of pattern for a complete list of the fabrics, notions, & hardware.

Sewing Machine

Bring your own machine or rent one from the shop (reserve when registering for the class). Bring power cord, foot pedal, and manual (you never know!), if using your own machine

Required Feet/Accessories/Needles (Extra needles are not included with Machine Rental)

Universal or Denim 14/90 needles

Open toed sewing foot

Zipper foot

Quarter inch foot

Edge foot (helpful but not necessary)

General Sewing Supplies (Not included with Machine Rental)

Thread to match all fabrics

Wonder Clips (These are a must when doing By Annie Bags)

Straight Pins

Scissors

Seam ripper

Chalk or Fabric Marker (I found the Clover white chalk marker works best)

Stiletto

Rotary Cutter and Mat (some are available on-site)

Rulers

Iron and Pressing Mat optional (some are available on-site)

Misc. Items

Pen, pencil and paper for making notes

Sack Lunch and Drink

Pre-Class Instructions

<u>Before Class</u> Allow adequate time to do these steps, do not try to accomplish this the night before class. You should plan on spending 6-8 hours for prep work.

1) Cut all fabrics, Soft & Stable, fusible interfacing (SF 101), and pattern pieces. The instructions are on page 2 & 3.

Fuse the interfacing to the corresponding pieces.

2) Quilt the fabric, cut out the pattern pieces and seal the edges. (Pages 2 & 3)

You can also use a narrow zigzag stitch or a 3 or 4 thread narrow overlock stitch on the serger to seal the edges.

- 3) Label all the pieces. Labels can be found on page 12. I suggest making a copy of the labels and use the copy in case you want to make another bag. Keep the original labels.
- 4) Prepare the bias binding. See page 1 of the pattern, section called "Making the Binding" This binding is used to cover all the seams outside the bag and is used in the final construction of the bag.
